Treats are sometimes used to encourage the animals, but staff say that the creatures take part by choice. [3] Artists have also involved animals in their work, and the results have been impressive. One created a piece called *Honeycomb Vase 'Made by Bees'* by putting a vase-shaped structure into a bee colony. It took 40,000 bees one week to build a hive around the structure. Writing a Concluding Paragraph

The last paragraph of an essay is the concluding paragraph. This paragraph includes a summary statement and leaves the reader with a final thought about the topic.

The summary statement restates the thesis without repeating the thesis statement from the introduction. Instead, it is one or two sentences long. When you paraphrase, you restate an idea using different words. To do this, you can use different words

Thesis: The city of Paris is more important than the characters in the movie *Midnight in Paris*.

Paraphrase: The location is the most element of the movie *Midnight in Paris*. It's even more central to the story than the are.



